

Payroll Management Practices for Honorary Employees in the Public Sector: The Case of Tirtayasa District

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Abstract

This study aims to determine the Disbursement Procedure for Honorary Employee Salary Funds in Tirtayasa District. Honorary labor is a person appointed by civil service supervisors in the government to carry out duties in government agencies to be a burden on the state revenue budget. This study employs a descriptive qualitative method using both Primary and Secondary Data Sources. Primary Data is obtained through interviews, while Secondary Data is gathered from books, the internet, and related documents. Informants include District Employees, Subdistrict Secretaries, Subdistrict Treasurers, and Village Community Empowerment officers in Tirtayasa District. The findings indicate that the disbursement of honorary employee salaries in Tirtayasa sub-district is based on the commitment and performance of the honorary employees, which is significantly improving their overall performance. Continuous guidance and motivation from the District Government are also necessary.

1. Introduction

In the modern era of globalization, organizations face increasing demands for efficiency, adaptability, and continuous improvement. Quality human resources are crucial to meet these demands, as they play a pivotal role in achieving organizational goals and maintaining competitive advantage. Consequently, developing and retaining competent employees, both in terms of knowledge and skills as well as job satisfaction, has become a top priority for organizations.

One of the fundamental aspects of job satisfaction is material compensation, which includes salaries and benefits provided to employees. Adequate compensation is essential as it directly impacts employees' motivation, performance, and overall job satisfaction. In Indonesia, Law Number 43 of 1999 regulates the types of positions, rights, obligations, and the implementation of civil servant management, including provisions for honorary employees.

This law allows authorized officials to appoint non-permanent or honorary employees to support the functions of government agencies.

The Tirtayasa District in Serang Regency, Banten Province, relies heavily on honorary employees to perform various administrative functions. These employees play a significant role in ensuring the smooth operation of government services by handling tasks that exceed the capacity of the permanent workforce. However, the district has encountered recurring issues related to the disbursement of salaries for honorary employees, leading to dissatisfaction and decreased productivity.

The phenomenon of delayed salary disbursement for honorary employees is not unique to Tirtayasa District but is reflective of a broader issue faced by many regions in Indonesia. These delays can be attributed to several factors, including bureaucratic inefficiencies, lack of coordination between departments, and outdated payroll systems. The impact of these delays extends beyond financial strain for employees; it also affects their morale and overall job performance.

Honorary employees, who already face job insecurity due to their non-permanent status, are further demotivated when their salaries are not disbursed on time. Many of these employees rely heavily on their monthly salaries to meet basic living expenses. Delays in disbursement can result in significant hardship, compelling some to seek additional employment or rely on loans, thereby affecting their focus and productivity at work. Moreover, the lack of timely payment undermines trust in the local government's ability to manage its workforce effectively, potentially leading to higher turnover rates and difficulties in attracting qualified personnel in the future.

Addressing the issues in the salary disbursement process for honorary employees is crucial for several reasons. First, it ensures that employees are fairly compensated for their work, which is fundamental to maintaining morale and job satisfaction. Second, it contributes to the overall efficiency and effectiveness of government operations by ensuring that employees can focus on their duties without the distraction of financial concerns. Third, it helps build trust between employees and the local government, fostering a more positive and productive work environment.

Efforts to streamline the payroll process in Tirtayasa District can serve as a model for other regions facing similar challenges. Implementing modern payroll systems, improving inter-departmental communication, and ensuring strict adherence to established procedures are steps that can mitigate delays and enhance overall administrative efficiency. Moreover, regular training and development programs for personnel involved in payroll management can help ensure that they are equipped with the necessary skills and knowledge to manage the process effectively.

This study focuses on examining the existing procedures for salary disbursement to honorary employees in Tirtayasa District. The primary objectives are to identify the root causes of delays, evaluate the effectiveness of current systems and processes, and propose recommendations for improvement. By conducting a thorough analysis, this research aims to contribute to the development of more efficient payroll management practices that can be adopted by other regions facing similar issues.

2. Literature Review

Regional Autonomy

Regional autonomy is a cornerstone of decentralized governance, allowing local governments to manage their own administrative affairs within the framework of national laws. This concept is pivotal in fostering local democracy, encouraging regional development, and ensuring that government services are more responsive to the specific needs of local communities.

Definition and Principles:

- **Law No. 23 of 2014** defines regional autonomy as the right, authority, and obligation of autonomous regions to regulate and manage their own governmental affairs and the interests of the local community in the Unitary State system of the Republic of Indonesia. The principles underpinning regional autonomy include democracy, decentralization, empowerment, equity, and attention to regional diversity.

Key Aspects:

1. **Decentralization:** It involves transferring authority from the central government to regional governments, empowering them to make decisions and manage resources independently. This decentralization aims to enhance the efficiency and effectiveness of public administration.
2. **Local Governance:** By granting autonomy, local governments can tailor their policies and programs to better address local needs and priorities. This leads to improved public services and more engaged citizenry.
3. **Financial Independence:** Regional autonomy promotes economic self-sufficiency by allowing regions to generate and manage their own revenues through local taxes and other financial mechanisms. This financial independence is crucial for sustainable regional development.

Challenges and Opportunities:

- While regional autonomy offers significant benefits, it also presents challenges such as ensuring equitable distribution of resources, maintaining accountability, and preventing corruption. Effective implementation of regional autonomy requires robust legal frameworks, strong institutions, and continuous capacity building for local officials. Opportunities lie in the potential for innovation in local governance, increased public participation, and enhanced service delivery.

Impact on Public Services:

- Studies have shown that regions with greater autonomy tend to perform better in delivering public services. Decentralization can lead to more efficient allocation of resources, tailored policies, and greater accountability. For example, a study by Bahl and Linn (1992) highlighted that fiscal decentralization could improve service delivery in sectors such as health and education by bringing decision-making closer to the beneficiaries.

Honorary Employees

Honorary employees, or non-permanent staff, are crucial in supporting the functions of government agencies, especially in regions with limited resources. They are appointed to assist permanent civil servants in managing the workload and delivering essential public services.

Roles and Responsibilities:

- Honorary employees are involved in various administrative and operational tasks. Their duties may include clerical work, data entry, customer service, and other support functions that are essential for the smooth operation of government services. Despite their non-permanent status, honorary employees are integral to maintaining the efficiency and effectiveness of public administration.

Compensation and Job Security:

- The compensation for honorary employees is often less stable compared to permanent staff, reflecting their temporary status. This can lead to job insecurity and financial instability, which in turn affects their motivation and performance. Ensuring timely and fair compensation is essential to maintaining their morale and productivity.

Regulatory Framework:

- Government Regulation No. 48 of 2005 and No. 56 of 2012 outline the criteria, responsibilities, and compensation mechanisms for honorary employees. These regulations aim to standardize employment conditions and ensure fair treatment.

However, the implementation of these regulations often faces challenges, including bureaucratic inefficiencies and lack of coordination.

Payroll Management Challenges:

- Effective payroll management for honorary employees is crucial for ensuring timely and accurate salary disbursements. Inefficiencies in the payroll system can lead to delays and errors, which negatively impact the financial well-being and job satisfaction of honorary employees. Research by Mulyadi (2016) emphasizes the importance of robust accounting systems in managing payroll processes efficiently. He identifies key elements such as accurate record-keeping, timely processing, and compliance with regulatory requirements as critical components of an effective payroll system.

Case Studies and Best Practices:

- Several case studies highlight successful payroll management practices that can be adopted to improve the system. For instance, the implementation of automated payroll systems in certain districts has significantly reduced processing times and errors, leading to more reliable salary disbursements. Training and development programs for payroll personnel have also been shown to enhance the accuracy and efficiency of payroll operations.

Theoretical Framework:

- The theoretical framework for understanding the management of honorary employees includes concepts from public administration, human resource management, and organizational behavior. Theories such as Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs and Herzberg's Two-Factor Theory provide insights into the factors influencing employee motivation and satisfaction. These theories highlight the importance of timely and adequate compensation, job security, and a supportive work environment in maintaining high levels of employee motivation and performance.

Implications for Policy and Practice:

- Policymakers and administrators must prioritize the development and implementation of efficient payroll systems to ensure the timely and accurate disbursement of salaries for honorary employees. This includes adopting modern technology, improving coordination between departments, and providing regular training for payroll personnel. By addressing these challenges, governments can enhance the performance and satisfaction of honorary employees, contributing to better public service delivery.

Future Research Directions:

- Future research could focus on comparative studies of different regions to identify best practices in payroll management for honorary employees. Additionally, exploring the impact of technological advancements, such as blockchain and artificial intelligence, on payroll processing could provide innovative solutions to existing challenges. Understanding the socio-economic factors that influence the job satisfaction and performance of honorary employees could also inform more targeted policy interventions.

3. Methodology

This study aims to investigate the procedure for disbursing salary funds for honorary employees in Tirtayasa District. The research was conducted over a period of four months, from September 5, 2022, to December 25, 2022. A qualitative descriptive approach was employed to gain a comprehensive understanding of the disbursement procedures and identify potential areas for improvement. This method was chosen for its ability to provide in-depth insights into complex processes and the experiences of the individuals involved.

Primary data were collected through semi-structured interviews with key informants, including District Employees, Subdistrict Secretaries, Subdistrict Treasurers, and officers from the

Village Community Empowerment division. These interviews were designed to gather detailed information about the procedures, challenges, and potential improvements in the salary disbursement process. The semi-structured format allowed for flexibility in probing deeper into specific issues while ensuring that all relevant topics were covered.

Secondary data were gathered from various sources, including official documents, books, articles, and internet resources. These secondary data sources provided contextual and supporting information relevant to the study. The documents reviewed included payroll records, payment request letters (SPP), fund provision letters (SPD), and payment orders (SPM). These documents were essential in understanding the procedural and administrative aspects of the salary disbursement process.

The data collection process also included observations of the payroll process. These observations provided firsthand insights into the practical implementation of the procedures and helped identify any discrepancies or inefficiencies. By triangulating information from interviews, documents, and observations, the study ensured the credibility and reliability of the findings.

The data analysis process involved organizing all collected data systematically, coding the data to identify key themes, and conducting a thematic analysis to uncover underlying meanings and relationships. Triangulation was used to validate the findings by cross-referencing information from different data sources and methods.

Ethical considerations were strictly adhered to throughout the research process. Informed consent was obtained from all interview participants, and their confidentiality was maintained by anonymizing their identities in the research reports and securely storing all data. Transparency in the research process was ensured by clearly documenting all steps and decisions taken during the study.

However, the study acknowledges certain limitations. The research was limited to the Tirtayasa District, which may affect the generalizability of the findings to other regions. The qualitative nature of the study may introduce subjectivity in data interpretation, though efforts were made to mitigate this through systematic analysis and triangulation. Additionally, the four-month research period may have limited the depth of data collection and analysis.

By addressing these limitations and adhering to rigorous methodological standards, this study aims to provide valuable insights into the salary disbursement procedures for honorary employees in Tirtayasa District and offer practical recommendations for improvement.

4. Results

Salary Disbursement Procedure

The procedure for disbursing honorary employees' salaries in Tirtayasa District involves several critical steps. Initially, the Payment Request Letter (SPP) is prepared and submitted by the personnel section. This letter is then forwarded to the Head of the Agency for approval. Once approved, the SPP is sent to the Regional Financial and Asset Management Agency (BPKAD) for verification. The BPKAD reviews the documents and issues a Fund Disbursement Order (SP2D) after ensuring that all requirements are met. Finally, the funds are transferred to the respective bank accounts of the honorary employees.

The study identified that the current payroll system in Tirtayasa District is supported by an adequate accounting information system, which facilitates the accurate and timely processing of salary payments. However, despite the existing system, several issues were noted that contribute to delays and inefficiencies in the salary disbursement process.

5. Discussion

Current Practices and Challenges

The current salary disbursement procedure in Tirtayasa District is structured but faces several challenges that affect its efficiency. One major issue is the bureaucratic bottlenecks that occur during the approval and verification stages. These bottlenecks often lead to delays in the issuance of the SP2D, which in turn delays the transfer of funds to employees' accounts.

Interviews with key informants revealed that the approval process is often slowed down by the need for multiple sign-offs from various officials, each of whom must verify the accuracy and completeness of the submitted documents. This multi-layered approval process, while necessary for ensuring compliance and accountability, contributes to significant delays.

Another challenge identified is the lack of real-time communication and coordination between different departments involved in the payroll process. For instance, delays in communication between the personnel section and the BPKAD can result in incomplete or incorrect documentation being submitted, which then requires additional time for corrections and resubmissions.

Impact of Delays on Employees

The delays in salary disbursement have a notable impact on the financial stability and morale of honorary employees. Many of these employees rely heavily on their monthly salaries to meet their living expenses. Delays in salary payments can lead to financial hardship, forcing employees to seek alternative sources of income or take out loans, which can further strain their financial situation.

Moreover, the uncertainty and frustration caused by delayed payments can negatively affect employee morale and motivation. Interviews indicated that some honorary employees feel undervalued and demotivated due to the recurring issues with salary disbursement. This can lead to decreased productivity and a decline in the overall quality of public services provided by these employees.

Recommendations for Improvement

Based on the findings of this study, several recommendations can be made to improve the salary disbursement process for honorary employees in Tirtayasa District:

1. **Streamlining the Approval Process:**
 - Simplify the approval workflow by reducing the number of sign-offs required. Implementing digital signatures and an automated approval system could expedite the process while maintaining accountability.
2. **Enhancing Inter-Departmental Communication:**
 - Improve real-time communication and coordination between the personnel section and the BPKAD through the use of integrated information systems. Regular meetings and updates can also help in addressing any issues promptly.
3. **Implementing a Real-Time Tracking System:**
 - Develop and implement a real-time tracking system for salary disbursement requests. This system would allow all stakeholders to monitor the status of requests and address any delays immediately.
4. **Regular Training and Capacity Building:**
 - Provide regular training for staff involved in the payroll process to ensure they are up-to-date with the latest procedures and technologies. Capacity building initiatives can enhance their efficiency and reduce the likelihood of errors.
5. **Feedback Mechanism:**
 - Establish a feedback mechanism where employees can report issues and suggest improvements. This would help in identifying recurring problems and developing targeted solutions.
6. **Audit and Evaluation:**

- Conduct regular audits and evaluations of the payroll system to identify inefficiencies and areas for improvement. These audits should focus on compliance, accuracy, and timeliness of salary disbursements.

Implications for Policy and Practice

Implementing these recommendations can significantly improve the efficiency of the payroll system in Tirtayasa District, ensuring that honorary employees receive their salaries on time. This would not only enhance their financial stability and morale but also contribute to better service delivery in the public sector. Moreover, the lessons learned from this case study can be applied to other regions facing similar challenges, promoting best practices in payroll management across the country.

By addressing the root causes of delays and inefficiencies in the salary disbursement process, local governments can build trust and confidence among their employees, fostering a more productive and motivated workforce. Ultimately, this would lead to improved public service delivery and greater satisfaction among the communities they serve.

6. Conclusion

The salary disbursement procedure for honorary employees in Tirtayasa District is structured but requires improvements to ensure timely and accurate payments. Addressing bureaucratic bottlenecks, enhancing inter-departmental communication, and implementing real-time tracking systems are crucial steps towards improving the efficiency of the payroll process.
